Campers/RV's : He suggests temporarily lifting the restriction (occupancy time frame) on Campers/RV's with an option of an extension by either 6 or 12 months so that those displaced by the storm can stay in a Camper/RV for an extended period of time.

Council agrees to a 12-month period and a resolution will be brought before council next week for approval.

Waiver of permit fees: He suggests waiver of zoning and floodplain permit fees for those who are trying to repair/rebuild from the storm.

Council agrees to this and a resolution will be brought before council next week for approval.

Moratorium on new development in flood plain: It has been proposed to place a moratorium on any new development in the flood plain areas in light as to what has happened with the recent storm. This would particularly apply to multifamily developments and schools. If the council is interested in this, he will come back with something for them to review in November as it will take some time to research this.

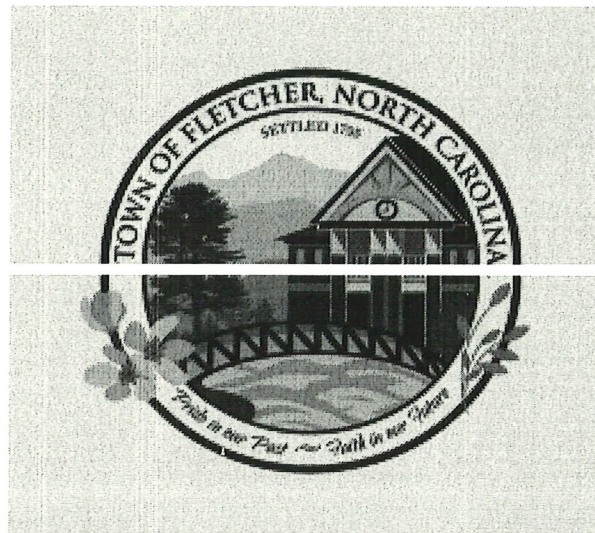

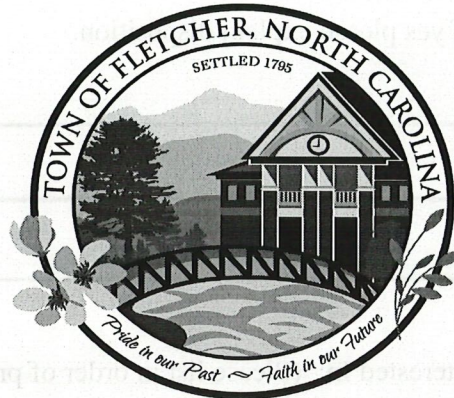

***Resolution of the Fletcher Town Council to Set a
12 Month Moratorium on New Development Within
FEMA Designated Floodplains***

WHEREAS, The Town of Fletcher has determined a need to evaluate current regulations and determine higher standards for development within FEMA designated floodplains in the wake of Hurricane Helene; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Fletcher staff and consulting engineer will be involved in permitting and inspections related to repairs and rebuilding of existing structures within floodplain for some months to come.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fletcher Town Council hereby establishes a 12-month moratorium for any new proposed development within officially designated floodplains subject to the regulations of Appendix 1 of the Fletcher Land Development Code (Floodplain Damage Prevention Ordinance). The moratorium shall not apply to developments with prior permits or approvals from the Town of Fletcher or to proposals for additions to, or accessory dwellings, at existing single-family properties. This moratorium shall be set to terminate on November 12, 2025, or upon approval of amendments to the Land Development Code related to floodplain development, whichever comes first.

SUBJECT: Tropical Storm Helene Disaster Response Report

It has been one month since Tropical Storm Helene battered western North Carolina. The Town of Fletcher as a community sustained significant damage but not at the catastrophic levels that some other areas experienced. This is not to minimize the damage sustained to homes and businesses here. They are however cleaning up and trying to determine the best path forward for repairing or reconstructing their properties. The most pressing question from the public right now has been debris removal.

Debris Removal

The Town of Fletcher and other municipalities in Henderson County have been working with Henderson County officials to begin a countywide effort to remove debris associated with the storm. The County has identified Southern Disaster Recovery (SDR) as its contractor to undertake this process. Information has been shared on the County's and Town's website about placing debris curbside for the contractor to pick up. Instructions have also been given for separating debris into different piles, based on what it is, so that the contractor can safely and properly dispose of it.

As of this report, the contractor has started work in the Southchase subdivision of Fletcher. They will work through that community and then on to other parts of town. I have indicated to them that Fanning Bridge Road and the streets off of Fanning Bridge are a priority due to debris encroaching into the right-of-way. The Cane Creek Industrial Park area has also been mentioned as a priority due to the large amounts of commercial debris from the Fletcher Business Park building.

Debris removal is going to take up to a year to complete in Henderson County. They have started and are making progress but they are also preaching patience. County officials have also indicated that the contractor will make multiples passes to pick up all debris.

Assistance from FEMA for the General Public

FEMA has set up a disaster recovery center (DRC) in the Blue Ridge Commons shopping center located at 2111 Asheville Highway in Henderson County. A DRC is a one-stop shop where survivors can meet face-to-face with FEMA representatives, apply for FEMA

assistance, receive referrals to local assistance in their area, apply with the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) for low-interest disaster loans and much more.

FEMA financial assistance may include money for basic home repairs, personal property losses or other uninsured, disaster-related needs, such as childcare, transportation, medical needs, funeral or dental expenses.

FEMA is also assisting with temporary housing needs for those who have been displaced. They are doing this by issuing vouchers that can be used at certain hotels. They are also working with the County to identify a location to bring in mobile homes and RVs that will provide extended housing assistance while people make plans to either rebuild or relocate to other homes.

FEMA Assistance for Damage to Public Facilities

Damage to public facilities of the Town was mostly contained to Bill Moore Community Park. Staff has been working to clean up and clear debris from the main portion of the park in order to open it back up to the public for limited recreational use. The Town's insurance provider has been out to see the damage and will provide a report on what will be covered. Expenses for repairs that are not covered by insurance will be submitted to FEMA for reimbursement.

Damage was also sustained to some Public Works equipment. The oldest of the Town's three garbage trucks was totaled. A chipper and mower were also totaled due to flood damage. Insurance is helping to cover these losses.

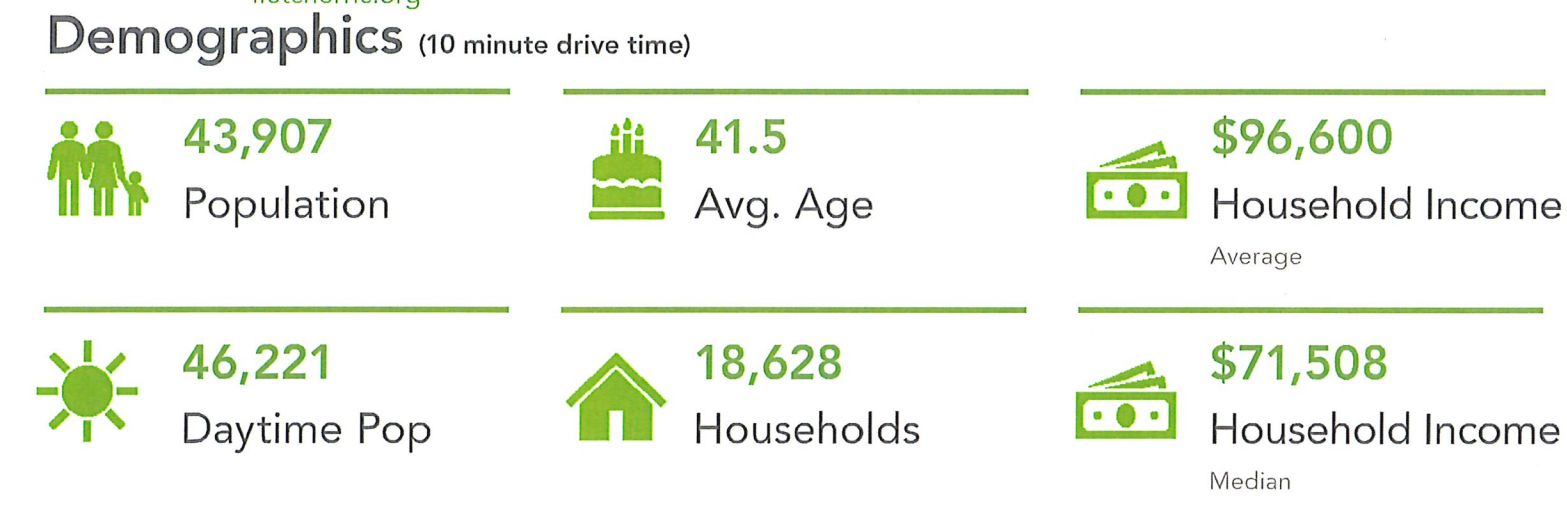

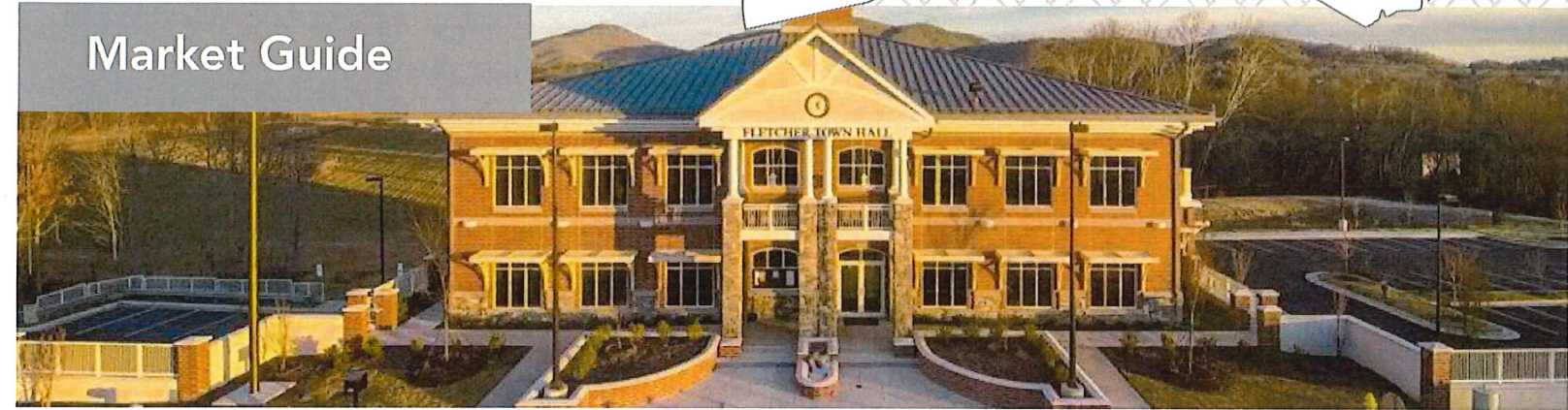
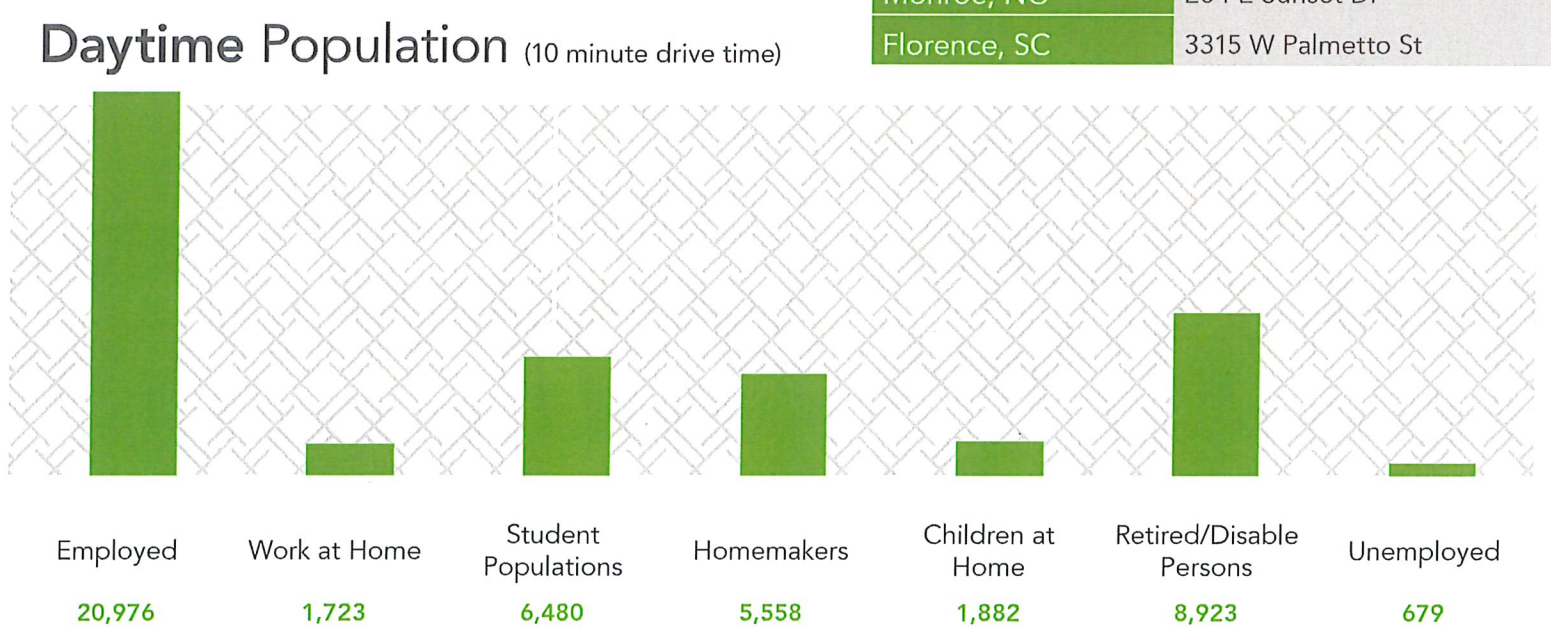


Peer Analysis

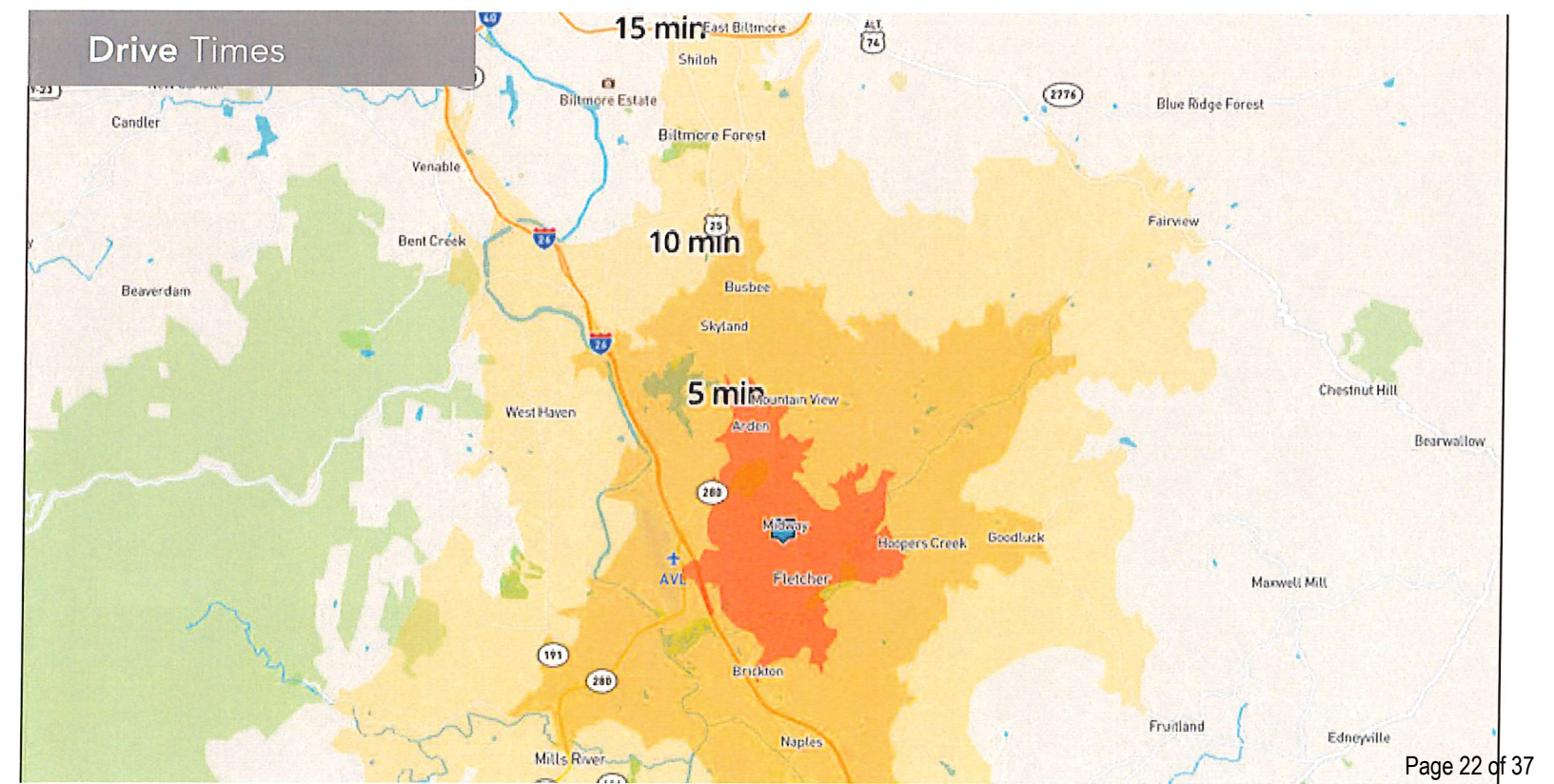

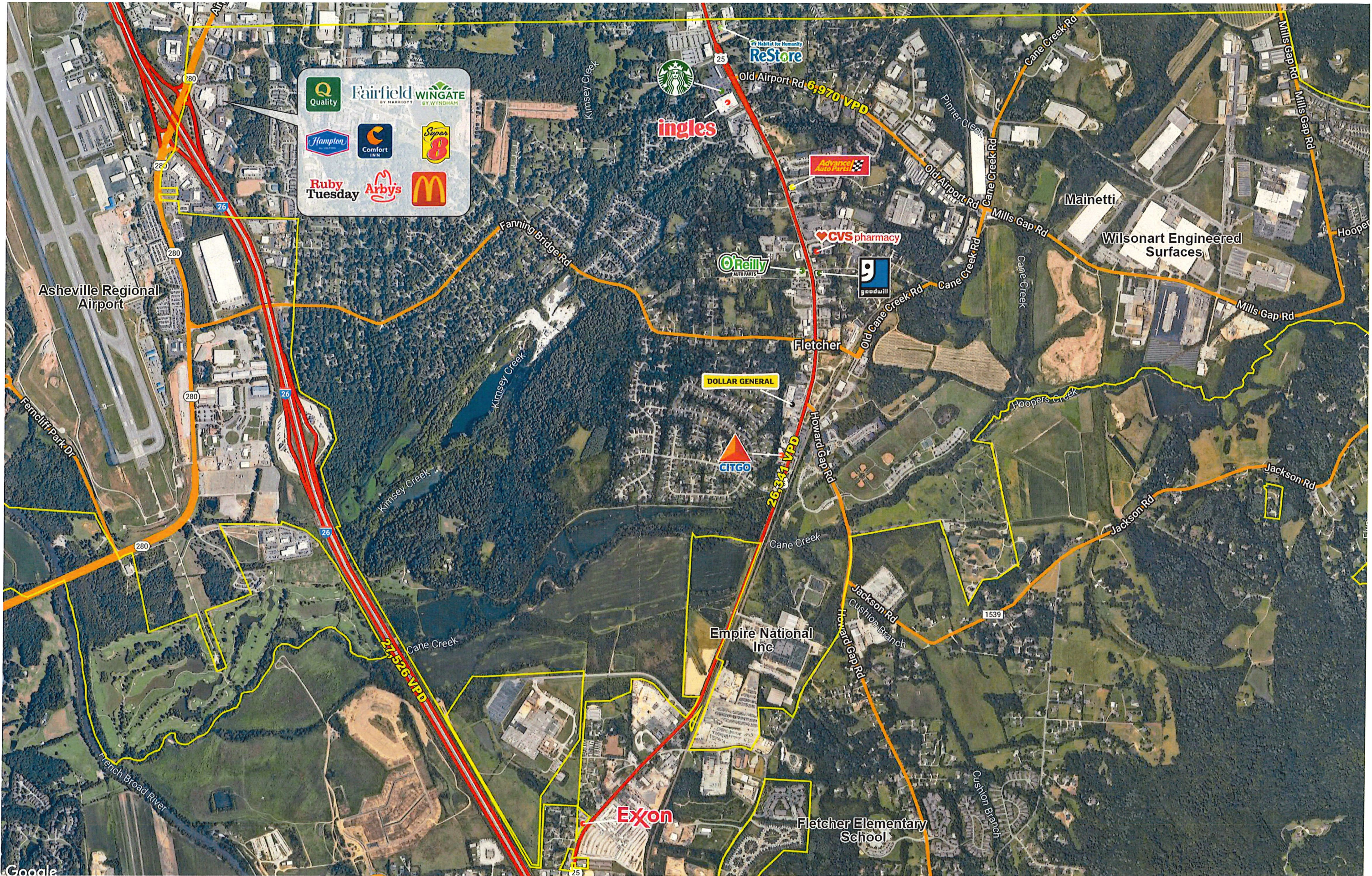

Assistant Town Manager:

- **Hurricane Helene:**
 - FEMA
 - Applied for Public Assistance and an exploratory meeting has been scheduled for early November with our assigned FEMA person.
 - Created spreadsheets to track various costs (labor, equipment, etc.) for various projects in the park as part of the FEMA reimbursement process.
 - Listened to a few webinars to learn more about the FEMA Public Assistance program.
- **Website/Facebook:**
 - Continuing to work on updating the Town's website with current Town information especially in light of Hurricane Helene updates. Also trying to post to the Town's Facebook account a couple times a week.

Finance:

- **Taxes for 2024-** During October we have collected over 18.7% of the levy as of 10/30. This amount will increase as we continue through the fall and early winter months.
- **Business Registration Revenue-** Susan continues to work on collecting outstanding business registrations.
- **FY 23/24 Audit-** Auditors were here on October 15 to finish the audit after being rescheduled due to Hurricane Helene. Carol Avery, Manager with Lowdermilk Church & Co (auditors) will be here at a later Council meeting to report on the audit of FY 23/24.
- **FY 23/24 Financial Statements -** Heather wrapped up the financial statement process as well as completed the Annual Financial Report Form (AFIR) for the State Treasurer as well. The financial statements will be sent to the LGC shortly for their approval.

Human Resource:

- **Employment-**
 - Police Officer Vacancies- two interviews were held in October for our vacancies
 - Parks and Recreation Director- accepted Greg's retirement notice effective 12/15/24 and working with Mark on the next steps to fill this vacancy.

 - Employee Gym- Over 42 hours were spent in the employee wellness gym as of 10/31.

Brush Pick Up

At this time, Public Works has suspended brush collection in lieu of Henderson County has contracted storm debris removal from Hurricane Helene.

Vehicles

We are still performing maintenance on Town vehicles; however, a total is not available at this time.

Public Works lost two pieces of equipment from the flood. Our oldest garbage truck (2002 Condor) was under over 6' of water. Our 2014 chipper was completely covered in water. Both pieces of equipment were parked in the truck shed. All other pieces of equipment were removed before they were flooded.

Sanitation

Here is a comparison for consideration.

In the first two weeks of October 2023, Public Works collected 77 tons of garbage at a cost of \$4,318.92.

In the first two weeks of October 2024, Public Works collected 158.86 tons of garbage at a cost of \$10,008.18.

The increase is from Hurricane Helene is from household waste. No flood items were collected.

Bill Moore Community Park

Public Works is currently working at Bill Moore Community Park, in hopes of getting the Park open soon. We have removed all the storm debris, rebuilt trails and hauled gravel for a base for the trails.

We are currently removing the damaged fences at the ball fields and will then move to the multi-purpose courts.

Public Works is working on the removal of the massive log jam at the bridge. The upper trail is closed at this time, as we are focusing our attention on the main area of the Park.

Public Works will repair a small washout along the stream bank across from the concession stand.

Public Works will continue to work on the cleanup of the Park for several more months.

Monthly Update— October, 2024

Planning & Zoning

Planning Board/ZBA – The board did not meet in October. The next meeting will be Nov. 19. Staff will update the Board on recent post-Helene items and discuss some minor amendments to the LDC.

- Continued day to day issuance of permits, fielded inquiries about potential new developments, and responded to miscellaneous complaints (various complaints involving zoning, solid waste, and/or junked vehicles.
- Continued work on implementation of various minimum measures related to the Town's MS4 Stormwater Permit. Continued discussions and work with Mary Roderick from LOS and Chris Brown from McGill on various aspects of the program.
- Have been working with McGill Associates as they work on the "substantial damage assessment" process post Helene. Structures damaged beyond 50% are required to be rebuilt in compliance with current floodplain regulations in the LDC. We anticipate having the first official determinations later this week, but early indications suggest that fortunately, there will not be a lot of structures damaged beyond the 50% threshold. Most likely the ones that do meet that threshold will be some mobile homes. I am fielding many inquiries from various residents/businesses etc. about repairs. In most cases, where they are simply repairing what was there previously, I am not requiring any zoning review and referring them to Henderson County for building permits.
- Working on Continuing Ed credits for CFM (Certified Floodplain Manager) certification. I am having to do this via online virtual classes as the NCAFPM conference scheduled in October was canceled.
- Participated in meeting with County Planning staff regarding a potential buyout program they are trying to put together for submittal to FEMA/State. Basically they are working to identify areas post Helene (primarily in floodplains) where property owners would potentially have the option to be bought out instead of rebuilding. If such a program was created (as was done in eastern NC following storms there), there would be federal funding that would come to NC. The program would likely be run by the state, completely voluntary, with no local match required, and Henderson County would be the property owner unless the Town wanted to own such properties for any reason.

Due to Storm Helene occurring on September 27th, no September report was completed. This report will maintain material from both September and October 2024.

Training & Professional Development:

- Sergeant Diaz began a 10-week long course at the National Forensic Academy at the University of Tennessee. He is scheduled to graduate the course in two weeks. This course will enhance the department capabilities as it pertains to processing crime scenes.
- Sergeant Kilby attended a 2-day Force Science De-escalation train the trainer course. This will provide him with materials and know-how to pass said training on to other members of the department.
- Officer Gibbard attended the 40-hour General Investigations Course.
- Several officers attended a 2-day Serving in the 21st Century Course.
- Chief Terry, Captain Fulmer, and Captain Gutierrez attended the Southern Police Institute's Performance Management Class being hosted at Town Hall. This class was the third of a four class certificate program with the University.

We had a total of 517 calls for service for the month of October. This does not include 1136 extra security checks. Fifty-three incident reports were filed. Twenty-six of these incidents required some type of investigative follow-up to be conducted. Twelve citations were issued for a total of 18 charges. Twenty-seven auto accidents were reported and 13 arrests made. It should be noted, due to Storm Helene, its devastating impact and the subsequent recovery efforts, enforcement activity was predictably low.

Activities of interest for the month of September/October include:

- The department participated in the response and subsequent recovery efforts pertaining to Hurricane Helene. Officers were required to work overtime in response to the hurricane, carrying out various tasks. Officers blocked flooded roadways, assisted in evacuating homes, participated in rescuing motorists stranded in flood waters, and conducted approximately 50 welfare checks requested from out-of-town individuals who could not locate or contact friends or family. In addition, officers assisted with the Distribution

Center located at Town Hall, where food, water, and other necessities were provided to those in need.



- Within days following Storm Helene, three death investigation were conducted. One was determined to be a suicide and the other two natural causes. None of the deaths were directly related to the storm.
- Officers worked with multiple other agencies in assisting with traffic control and closing roads related to several political visits to the area, including visits by Presidential Candidate Donald Trump, Candidate for Vice President Tim Walz, and First Lady Jill Biden.
- Subsequent to the storm and the business being closed, someone made entry into a broken window at Ingles stealing beer. The offender was identified, subsequently located

and admitted to his involvement in the breaking and entering. Felony Warrants were taken out against him.

- Community engagement activities for the month of September and October consisted of Chief Terry presenting to a TIPS training class, attendance at Blue Ridge Community College for a leadership discussion, participating in the Fletcher Family Fun Festival, Hunter Auto Group's Halloween event, and Safelight's Night of Hope. Members of the department also attended the Henderson County Human Trafficking Task Force meeting and a visit was made to the county clerk's office to recognize them for their assistance in helping the department transition to the new e-courts system.

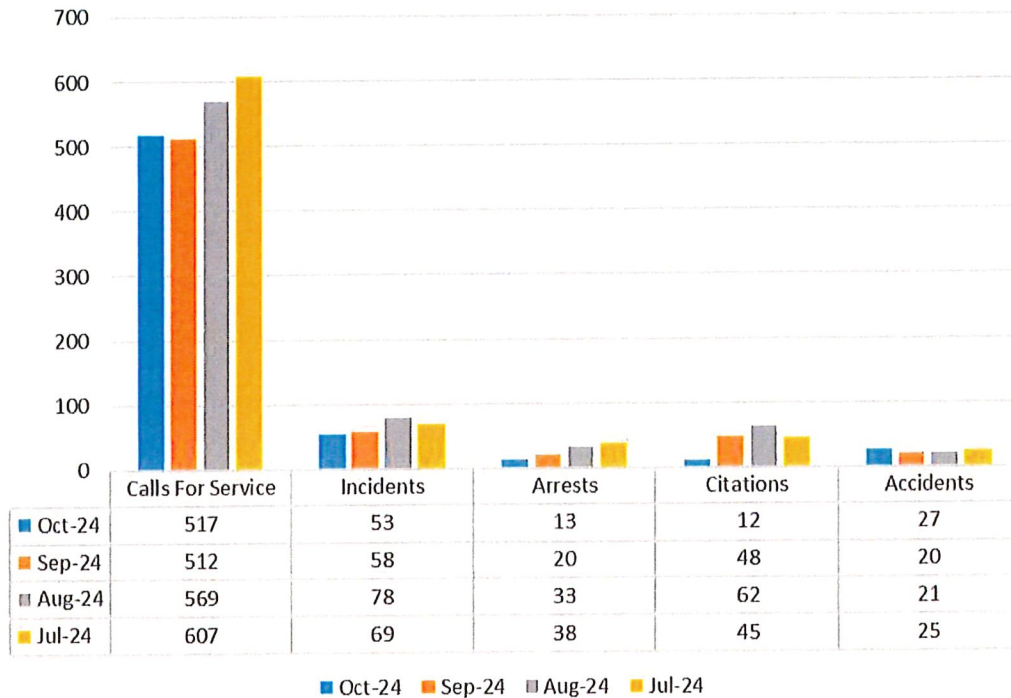

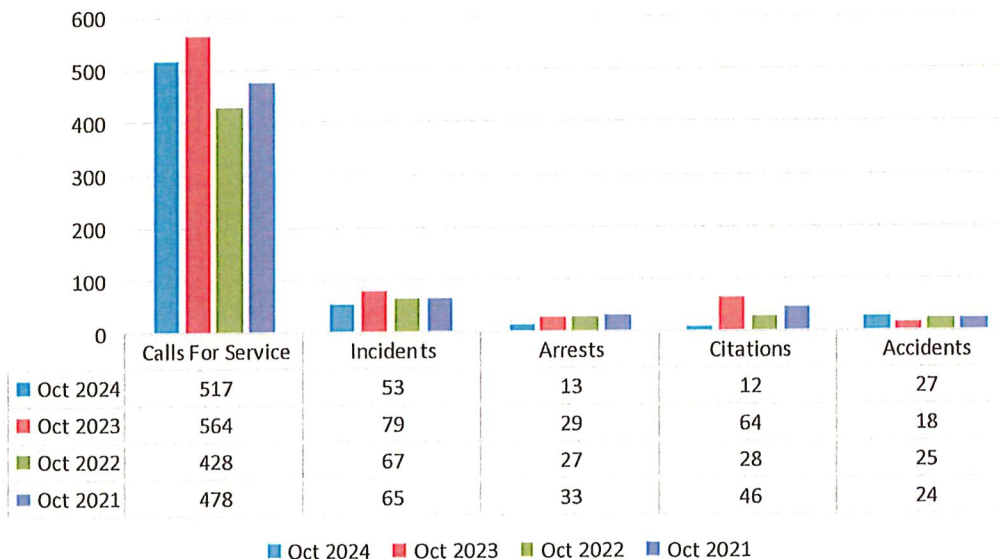
