This week we have Mr. Adam Eberhardt here who is also interested in serving on the planning board. He then asked Mr. Eberhardt to come to the podium to introduce himself and state as to why he would like to serve on the planning board.

Mr Eberhardt came to the podium, introduced himself to council and answered questions that they had for him.

Presentation and annual report from Asheville Regional Airport—Lew Bleiweis, Executive Director.

Mayor Pro-Tem Trevor Lance motioned to approve economic incentives for project "Blaze" and it was seconded by Councilmember Jim Player.

Request for express design of key intersections and road extension in support of Town Center development - Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager

Town Manager Mark Biberdorf stated that I talked with you last week about doing some proactive transportation engagement discussion with DOT and also our French Broad MPO. We met with them, and they came back with an update on potential improvements along HWY 25 that would help with traffic flow but also support further development of the Heart of Fletcher project. The express design will allow the MPO to submit this plan on our behalf to DOT to get them to come up with some design options and present an estimated cost. I ask by motion that we start this process and I think it will help us get this work going. Even if we do not reach a deal with Lewis Real Estate, there may be another potential developer that will help get the work going on potential transportation improvements.

Discussion Followed:

Mayor Blakely asked for a motion to support a request for the express design of key intersections for the Town Center Development.

Councilmember Jim Player motioned to support the express design of key intersections, and it was seconded by Councilmember Keith Reed.

Motion all in favor.

Town Manager Report

Last week I talked to you about our meetings with the legislative delegation, (priorities list) and we recently met with Kye Laughter from Senator Bud's office and next we will try and meet with Robin Ramsey from Senator Tillis's office. I recently submitted all of our information online with Congressman Edwards' office and sent a letter of support about trying to extend sewer to those three streets off of Fanning Bridge Road. I'll follow up to see if they have identified any funding sources for that.

On the Budget update, we are in the throes of the budget process and I mentioned last week we are working to finalize our revenue estimates. Probably by the end of this week or the beginning of next week, we will have a draft of what our revenues are looking like for the

upcoming fiscal year, particularly with putting the final touches on our expense requests. I will then work on a balanced budget to present to you during our May 7th budget workshop.

Our Spring shredding event/pill drop is coming up on Saturday, April 25th, from 9:00 until noon.

We are also in the middle of our spring litter sweep as we are trying to get people to organize a pick-up. I'll put out some additional information on this as well.

I was talking to our Planning & Zoning Director about public hearings. We have always had a practice of putting on the consent agenda to set a public hearing for the following months' meeting (usually land use issues). All require a public hearing, but there is not a requirement that you set a public hearing prior to holding the actual public hearing.

Discussion Followed:

Council agrees to no longer put this on the consent agenda prior to the actual public hearing.


