The Shred event/pill drop will be in the south side parking lot from 9:00 to noon on Saturday, April 20, 2024.

The Spring Litter Sweep is from April 13 through 27 that DOT promotes and I will put a call out for people to see if anyone wants to participate we provide the garbage bags and vests.

On the Budget process we are getting closer to finalizing our expenses, estimates, and requests, We are working on revenue estimates right now and the last thing that I am waiting on is the final tax values from the county. I am hoping to have a final draft at the end of this month. My goal is to do this without a rate increase.

The last thing is an update on crown castle and their placement of the small cell wireless facilities. They have finalized 6 nodes (locations) that would be in town on DOT roads. The

one in Windsor Forrest that has created the most issues has not been specifically decided as of yet that it will be on Fanning Bridge Road somewhere but that have not decided the specific location. I don't have the new map as of yet when I do I will share it with you.

Cane Creek Greenway Extension	Town of Fletcher	Areas along Cane Creek extending from Bill Moore Community Park in Fletcher toward the French Broad River.	\$3,000,000 - \$5,600,000	The Town of Fletcher has been working for several years with adjoining property owners and Conserving Carolina to extend the Cane Creek Greenway. This would help to create a new leg of our greenway system that could connect with a larger regional system. Funding from the legislature could be used as a potential grant match along with local funding. The Town is also pursuing federal grants for this project.
Fanning Bridge Road Sewer Extension Project	Town of Fletcher	Westfield Road, North Hudson Lane, and Dogwood Terrace located off of Fanning Bridge Road	\$700,000 - \$900,000	Certain areas of Fletcher do not have sanitary sewer service but could greatly benefit from this service due to struggling septic systems. One particular area that would benefit from the extension of sewer is a neighborhood located off of Fanning Bridge Road. This neighborhood consists of the properties located on Westfield Road, North Hudson Lane, and Dogwood Terrace. The Town has been in communication with the Metropolitan Sewerage District (MSD) to discuss the logistics for extending sewer service to the Fanning Bridge Road neighborhood.
